SUBJECT: Legislative Report (February 2024)

BACKGROUND

The Legislature is in full swing, undertaking its second year of the two-year legislative session that began on January 3, 2024. As new legislation is introduced in the Capitol, a deadline of note is the last day for bills to be introduced (February 17). Additional key deadlines are identified in the legislative calendars attached to this report.

OC LAFCO, through participation on the California Association of LAFCOs (CALAFCO) Legislative Committee monitors proposed legislation of LAFCO interest. During the committee's January 12 meeting, CALAFCO staff provided an update on bills continued from the 2023 legislative session and this year's Omnibus Bill. Reports were also given on the completion of the appointments to the committee and the current lack of activity in Sacramento. While there is anticipation that the pace of the Legislature will pick up in the coming weeks, the 2024 Omnibus Bill looks differently than in prior years with only a single proposed change to the CKH Act. The Committee is set to meet next on February 16, and any changes involving legislative activity will be presented to the Commission in March.

A summary discussion of the Omnibus Bill and an overview of activities on the horizon involving legislation of LAFCO interest are provided in the next sections of this report.

2024 Omnibus Bill (Assembly Committee on Local Government)

CALAFCO and the Assembly Committee on Local Government are cosponsoring the annual Omnibus Bill to propose technical and non-substantive amendments to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 ("CKH Act"). The 2024 Omnibus Bill initially included four proposed amendments to the CKH Act to clarify LAFCO processes and authority. However, through a recent review by the legislative staff of the proposed amendments, only one of them was

identified as non-substantive. Consequently, this year's bill will only include proposed language that clarifies the tax exchange process for special district boundary changes explicitly when subject agencies waive the exchange of property tax revenue. The bill is currently not in print and is awaiting assignment of a bill number.

Year-Two: Potential Legislation of LAFCO Interest

To prepare for the 2024 legislative session, during the recent legislative committee meeting, CALAFCO staff did a refresher of the association's legislative policies and guidelines. The crash course session was intended to remind committee members of CALAFCO's key areas of interest on the legislative front and to assist in reviewing and adopting positions on legislation of LAFCO interest. In concert with that, CALAFCO has identified areas of interest, which include indemnification of LAFCO involving proposal applications, public meeting access, and consolidation of failing wastewater systems. The effort to require applicants to indemnify LAFCOs has become a two-year effort, and on February 5, Senator Dave Cortese of Santa Clara County agreed to author the bill. The progress of this effort represents a huge accomplishment by CALAFCO and the legislative committee. Staff will provide an update on these activities in the March legislative report.

Legislation and OC LAFCO Local Policies

Periodically, changes in legislation warrant changes to an OC LAFCO local policy. Recent changes involving employment labor, public records requests, and retention laws warrant a review of the Commission's respective policies for these areas. The review by staff and general counsel is currently underway, and proposed changes will be presented to the Commission in March.
